Reason for the rejection

Your application has been considered by the education institution(s) to which you have applied for admission. You have not been admitted, because the number of applicants has exceeded the admission capacity at the higher education programme(s) to which you have applied for admission. The education institutions have admitted the applicants considered most qualified based on an assessment of the individual applicant's qualifications in relation to the set admission criteria.

Criteria for selection in cases of restricted admission

Quota 1 admissions are allocated according to the grade point average of an upper secondary education. The grade point averages needed for admission will be published in the Danish press and at [Ufsn.dk/kot-hovedtal](https://ufsn.dk/kot-hovedtal) today the 28th of July 2026. The education institution(s) can inform you about this as well.

Quota 2 admissions are allocated according to other criteria published by the education institution(s) to which you have applied. You can find more information about the quota 2 admission criteria on the websites of the individual higher education institution.

You can get more information about the reason for the rejection of your application at the relevant higher education institution(s) to which you have applied for admission.

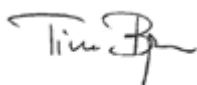
Appeals concerning the rejection of admission

If you find that your applications have not been assessed according to the existing rules and regulations, you must contact the higher education institution(s) to which you have applied for admission and inform them that you intend to appeal the decision.

A letter of appeal must be sent to the higher education institution within two weeks from the day you have received this letter.

Please contact the education institution to which you have applied, if you are not familiar with the existing rules and regulations of admission.

Please note vacant study places are offered to qualified applicants only - sometimes at first come first serve.
